

Correspondence:

- Mr. Grubbs questioned whether the items for bid at the Richie Brothers Auction were advertised.
- Mr. Grubbs questioned whether the close out report for state funds received for the cinder spreader was completed.
- Mr. Grubbs stated that the electric lines for the traffic signals are not registered on PA One Call.
 - Dale Handick questioned how the lines are to be located.
 - Mr. Grubbs explained that there are maps in the municipal office that have the lines marked.

Public Comments:

- Mr. Niederriter questioned if all of the police officers were back to work and how the department was looking financially.
- Mr. Winkler stated that the department is under budget and that he cut back their shifts voluntarily to watch expenses.
 - Mr. Niederriter questioned when the Township would start to receive Amusement Tax revenue.
 - Mr. Winkler stated after the advance from Live Nation is paid.
 - Mr. Turturice explained that there is revenue coming in from other businesses.
 - Mr. Winkler stated that police department is doing a good job.
 - Mr. Niederriter asked how many shows were scheduled at First Niagara Pavilion.
 - Mr. Winkler stated 16
 - Mr. Niederriter stated that the list he got from the internet that day says 13. He went on to question if the residents were being given any tickets for upcoming shows.
 - Mr. Winkler stated that he had received tickets for the first show only.
 - Mr. Niederriter asked if FNP planned on giving out any more.
 - Mr. Winkler explained that the pavilion used to make parking revenue off of the free tickets they sent residents and now parking is included in the price of the ticket.
 - Mr. Niederriter stated that the pavilions should give tickets to the residents. Mr. Winkler agreed that they should but it costs them money and that when he is given tickets, he offers them to residents at the monthly meetings.
 - Mr. Niederriter stated that the deal with Live Nation was not a bad deal, but that the Township had to pay the money back as opposed to the donation in years past.
 - Mr. Contumelio stated that the Township does not have to pay interest on the advance.
 - Mr. Winkler stated that there is still \$50,000 in the general account from the advance for police payroll that has not been used in any way. He went on to say that he feels the amusement tax is the best thing for the Township.
- Mrs. Cassidy addressed her concerns about the intersection at Clinton-Frankfurt Road and Hall Road.
- She stated that Hall Road is in horrible shape. She is concerned that there is going to be a terrible accident.
 - Mr. Grubbs asked what the specific problem was. Mrs. Cassidy explained that it was a visibility issue due to vegetation.
 - Mr. Winkler suggested that Mrs. Cassidy call Jesse White's office.
 - Mr. Grubbs stated that the Township can take care of the issue and that the road department can maintain the grass.
 - Mr. Duerr suggested that it is not the grass but the lay of the road as there is an issue with visibility even during the winter. He stated that he will go and take a look at the intersection and see what type of solution can be determined.
- Mr. Mills stated the police are doing a good job patrolling Devils Den Road and that the officers are very friendly.
