

The Hanover Township Board of Supervisors held a **Public Hearing** on **Thursday, March 15, 2012** at **7:14 pm** at the Municipal Building. Those present were David Duerr-Chairman, James Donohue-Vice Chairman, Herbert Grubbs-Supervisor, Kevin Lemmi-Supervisor, Donald Winkler-Supervisor, Wendy Turrentine-Secretary/Treasurer & Lane Turturice-Solicitor

**The Purpose of this Public Hearing is to consider the Airport Hazard Zoning Ordinance.**

Mr. Duerr explained that the summary of this ordinance has been advertised.

Mr. Grubbs stated that Airport Hazard Overlay Zoning Ordinance is required by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and it restricts activity and the height of buildings under the approach to Pittsburgh International Airport.

The area in Hanover Township this ordinance pertains to is near Murdocksville and Clinton Frankfurt Road and restricts the height of buildings to a 1800 feet above sea level. The Pittsburgh International Airport is 1200 feet about sea level. It restricts building height to 600-700 feet and deals with airway electric interference.

Mr. Grubbs announced that the Washington County Planning Commission has no comments or opinions except to have our solicitor review it.

Mr. Turturice stated that the ordinance is adequate to serve its purpose.

Mr. Grubbs stated that the ordinance was discussed at the February 28, 2012 Hanover Township Planning Commission meeting.

Mr. Duerr asked how the Township controls electrical interference.

Mr. Grubbs said the applicant would need to go to the Pa. aviation department for their permit before the township could issue our building permit.
